Reporting

After you have undertaken a monitoring visit there are a number of options for reporting your observations to the Norfolk Monuments Management Project. Please choose the option/s that you are most comfortable with.

- 1. Post the original copy of the monitoring form to the Norfolk Monument Management Project. The original copy will be returned to you as soon as possible.
- 2. Post a photocopy of the monitoring form to the Norfolk Monuments Management Project.

Providing an Excel document will help the Norfolk Monuments Management Project to collate monitoring data and automatically upload information into Historic Environment Records.
